Annual Report Fiscal Year 2019-2020





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I. Purpose

A. MISSION STATEMENT. The mission of the Downtown South Neighborhood Improvement District Advisory Council (NID) is to review, plan for and prioritize capital improvement projects necessary to improve the District, review financial grants with potential public and private funding partners, and coordinate some activities with the Downtown South Main Street Board of Directors.

II. Administration

- A. STAFF. The City provides staff support and administration for the Downtown South Neighborhood Improvement District Advisory Council. Key staff are as follows:

III. Board Members

- A. NUMBER. The Downtown South Neighborhood Improvement District Advisory Council has five (5) members who are recommended to the Mayor for appointment by the Nominating Board, appointed by the Mayor, and confirmed by City Council.
- B. REQUIREMENTS. The advisory council shall consist of five (5) members. Each member must own property in the district, represent a corporate owner of property within the district, or reside in the district. Members must be nominated and appointed to the advisory council pursuant to Article XV, Chapter 2, Orlando City Code. At least one member of the advisory council must be a representative of Orlando Health, at least one other member must be an owner of land within the district that is designated for industrial use on the City's future land use map, and at least one other member must be a board member of the City's SoDo District Main Street program. The board member from the City's SoDo District Main Street program may not serve as chair of the advisory board unless elected as provided by the by-laws of the district. In the event that a board member of the City's SoDo District Main Street program is not available to serve on the advisory council, then this seat must be filled by an owner of land, or a representative of a corporate owner of land, abutting Orange Avenue that is designated as mixed use corridor or activity center on the City's future land use map and that is utilized for retail or commercial use.
- C. ATTENDANCE. The annual attendance report is attached.
- D. TERMS. Term lengths are two (2) years each and no member may serve more than two (2) consecutive terms.

- H. BOARD APPOINTMENTS. Throughout Fiscal Year 2019-2020, one (1) new member was appointed and two (2) members were reappointed by Mayor Dyer and confirmed by City Council.
- I. ELECTIONS. On October 9, 2019, Charlotte Manley was elected Chair by a unanimous vote. On December 11, 2019, James Krawczyk was elected Vice Chair by a unanimous vote.
- J. BOARD MEMBER TRAINING. No Board member trainings were held during Fiscal Year 2019-2020.

IV. Meetings

- A. DAY AND TIME. The Downtown South Neighorhood Improvement District Advisory Council meets on the second Wednesday of each month at 9:00 a.m.
- B. NUMBER. The Downtown South Neighborhood Improvement District Advisory Council scheduled twelve (12) meetings in Fiscal Year 2019-2020 and held six (6) meetings. Meetings held July through September were held virtually via Zoom Webinar at 11:00 a.m. due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Volunteer hours for the Downtown South Neighborhood Improvement District Advisory Council for Fiscal Year 2019-2020 totaled 29.12 cumulative hours.
- C. SPECIAL MEETINGS. Neighborhood Advisory Board community meeting on the O-Line was held on August 19, 2020.



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V. Workload

A. SYNOPSIS. The Downtown South Neighbrhood Improvement District Advisory Council reviews plans for and prioritizes capital improvement projects necessary to improve the district, reviews financial grants with potential public and private partners, and coordinates with the South Downtown Orlando Main Street Board of Directors.

VI. Major Initiatives/Specific Accomplishments

A. MAJOR INITIATIVES.

1. Columbia Street and Sligh Rebuild Design

This project will begin in 2021 and will include new streets, infrastructure and streetscapes.

2. Orange Avenue Complete Streets Project Phase 2 Design

This project will include repaving, streetscape elements and branding designs along Orange Avenue from Pineloch to north of Grant Street. Estimated Completion Date: Late 2021

3. Regional Bike Trail on Division Street Design

This project will extend the regional bike trail from downtown along Division Street to Michigan Street. The project will also include a bike trail from Division Street to the SODO Train Station on Sligh Blvd. The project is currently in design and has been funded through FDOT.

Estimated Completion Date: 2021

4. Art Installations

Work and planning began on bringing multiple new art instillations into the district.

Estimated Completion Date: This is an on-going effort.

5. Marketing

New marketing material and media has been developed for the district. This includes an updated website, a new media video and data information. The District also held a developer forum to update the broker/investment community on the SODO vision and efforts.

Estimated Completion Date: This is an on-going effort.

6. Budget

An updated and refined budget was developed for the NID in 2018. This new document provides clarity on projects, timelines, additional funding, and estimated public investment within the district.

Estimated Completion Date: This is an on-going effort.

B. SPECIFIC ACCOMPLISHMENTS.

Work on the streetscape and road improvements for Orange Avenue Phase 1 was mostly completed in Fiscal Year 2019-2020. This included decrative crosswalks, new lighting, pavement, landscaping, ADA improvements and signage.
